Dementia is a common presentation in general practice. It is the leading cause of death in women in Australia and second leading cause of death overall.

This webinar, the second in a series of webinars on dementia, has been designed to provide GPs and nurses a stepwise approach to the assessment and diagnosis of dementia in general practice. The webinar will include an interactive discussion with panelists demonstrating a person centred approach to assessing people presenting with dementia.
