At Royal Melbourne Hospital, Dr Hogg supervises a coordinated range of services, linking inpatient acute and interventional pain management with out-patient multidisciplinary services, which includes management strategies for chronic cancer and non-cancer pain and telehealth-linked support to clinicians in western Victoria.

Dr Cameron-Taylor completed her medical degree at the University of Newcastle and completed rural General Practice training. She subsequently undertook advanced training in Palliative Medicine through
