This Spirometry training course provides comprehensive training in the application, measurement, and interpretation of expiratory spirometry in general practice. This six-hour interactive workshop includes a practical, hands-on component to allow participants to apply their new knowledge in a practical setting.

- Learn strategies to incorporate spirometry testing systematically into routine clinical practice
- Increase confidence in performing, understanding, and implementing spirometry.
