Quick guide to MBS rules and exceptions

Attendance items provided on the same day as a Chronic Disease Management (CDM) service

You can't bill CDM items and certain attendance items for the same patient on the same day. If you bill a CDM and restricted attendance item, Medicare will only pay a benefit for the CDM item number.

CDM item numbers 721, 723 and 732 cannot be billed with the following attendance item numbers:

Routine hours consultations	
In surgery	Item numbers <u>3</u> , <u>23</u> , <u>36</u> and <u>44</u>
Home / Institution / Hospital visits (excluding RACF)	Item numbers <u>4</u> , <u>24</u> , <u>37</u> and <u>47</u>
After hours consultations - urgent	Item number <u>585</u> , <u>599</u>
After hours consultations - non-urgent	
In the surgery	Item numbers <u>5000</u> , <u>5020</u> , <u>5040</u> , <u>5060</u>
Home / Institution (excluding RACF)	Item numbers <u>5003</u> , <u>5023</u> , <u>5043</u> , <u>5063</u>
Telehealth consultations	
Telehealth phone attendance	Item numbers <u>91890</u> , <u>91891</u>
Telehealth video attendance	Item numbers <u>91800</u> , <u>91801</u> , <u>91802</u>

Multiple attendances on the same day

You can bill multiple attendances for the same patient on the same day if:

- » They're separate attendances with a reasonable lapse of time between them.
- The subsequent attendances aren't a continuation of the attendances.

Scenario 1: you see a patient to treat a sore throat in the morning, the same patient returns at 4pm the same day seeking treatment for a sprained ankle.

- » You can bill the appropriate attendance item for each attendance.
- » The second attendance was not a continuation of the earlier consultation.
- There was a reasonable lapse of time between the two visits.

Helpful tip: make note of the time of each attendance on the account or include service text for electronic claims.

Scenario 2: you see a patient and give a prescription for an Implanon contraceptive implant. The patient returns to have the implant inserted after the pharmacy dispenses it.

» You can only bill one attendance item, the second visit was a continuation of the first attendance.

Biopsies for diagnosis (item 30071 and 30072)

- » You can bill MBS item 30071 for a diagnostic biopsy of skin or item 30072 for a diagnostic biopsy of mucous membrane.
- » If you perform multiple biopsies on separate lesions on the one day, make sure you note on the claim or account either:
 - 'separate sites'
 - the exact location of the biopsy.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccines support services

GPs and qualified health professionals can use items 93624-93661 to assess a patient's suitability to get a COVID-19 vaccine.

- » This service is free to patients and the MBS items must be bulk billed.
- » Vaccine support items can't be co-claimed with:
 - Bulk-billing incentive items <u>10990</u>, <u>10991</u>, <u>10992</u>, 75855, 75856, 75857, 75858.
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioner immunisation item 10988.

You can co-claim COVID-19 vaccine suitability assessment items with normal attendance items. For example, item number 23 where the patient both:

- » attends for an unrelated condition
- » is eligible for the vaccine.

Make a note on the account or include service text for electronic claims. Suitable text may include:

- » times of each attendance
- » 'unrelated to COVID-19 assessment' on the attendance item.
