How the program works for your practice

What is PHASES?

Preventing Heart Attacks and Stroke Events through Surveillance (PHASES) is a quality improvement program supporting general practices to improve cardiovascular disease prevention through Primary Sense data, practical tools, and Northern Queensland Primary Health Network (NQPHN) support.

How the program works

1. Invitation to participate

NQPHN will contact your practice to introduce PHASES and explain how it can support heart health care in your practice.

2. Getting started

If you choose to participate, NQPHN will:

- > help you get set up
- > ask you to complete a short baseline survey
- > work with you to identify a suitable focus area.

3. Understanding your data

You'll review Primary Sense reports to identify patients who may benefit from improved cardiovascular risk assessment and management.

4. Quality improvement in action

Your practice implements a quality improvement activity that fits your workflow, with access to:

- > practical tools and templates
- > training and education opportunities
- > ongoing NQPHN support.

5. Ongoing support

Your NQPHN will stay in touch to support progress, answer questions, and share learning opportunities.

6. Review and wrap up

At the end of the project, you'll complete a short follow up survey and review outcomes achieved through PHASES.
