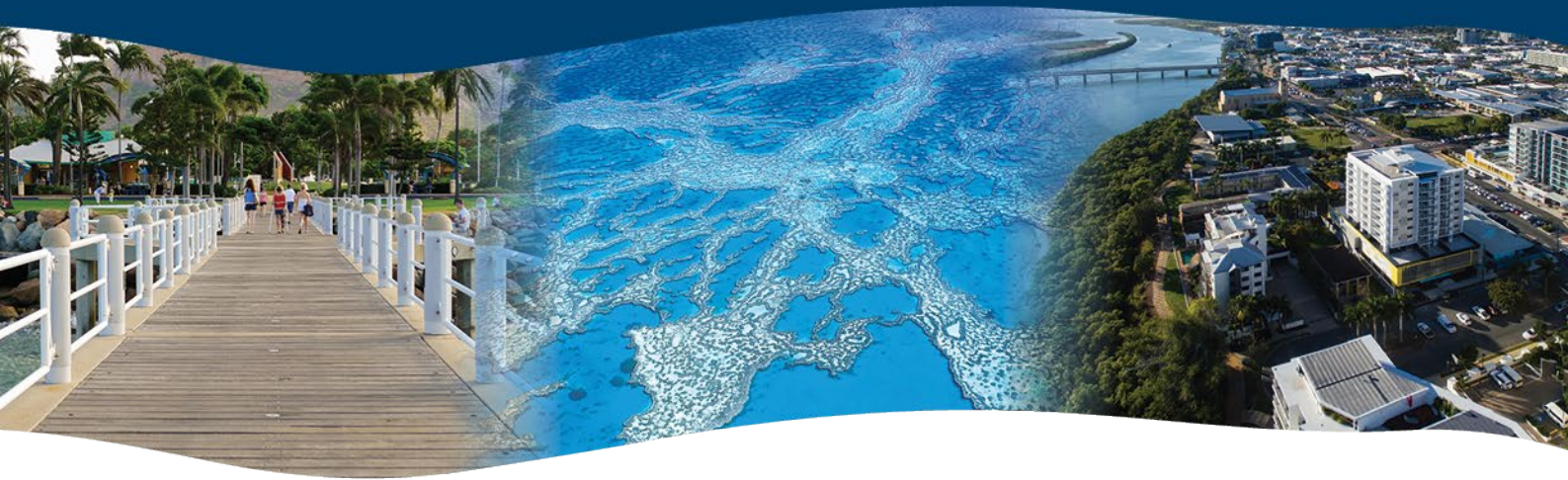

AOD - 1 - NIAS Operational and Mainstream Funding

Activity priorities and description

Program key priority areas

Alcohol and Other Drugs.

Aim of activity

The purpose of this activity is to improve access to community-based alcohol and other drug treatment interventions by commissioning a range of treatment services. This includes reducing harm associated with drugs and alcohol use, with a focus on methamphetamine use.

Description of activity

Northern Queensland Primary Health Network (NQPHN) commissions a number of alcohol and other drug (AOD) treatment services across the NQPHN footprint, spanning a range of specialist treatment interventions including counselling, case management, withdrawal management, and rehabilitation services.

NQPHN works with service providers to improve the coordination and integration of AOD treatment in the broader service system to ensure people have timely access to support, particularly people transitioning from mental health services such as the Medicare Mental Health Phone Service or stepped care services. Commissioned providers operate within a harm reduction framework, and support people with co-occurring mental health needs, with activity and outreach targeted based on local need.

These activities will continue to align with recommendations in the *National Drug Strategy 2017-2026* and with other AOD Activity Workplans to ensure efficient and effective commissioning of services.

AOD - 2 - NIAS Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people

Activity priorities and description

Program key priority areas

Alcohol and Other Drugs.

Aim of activity

The purpose of this activity is to improve access in community-based alcohol and other drug treatment interventions for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders by commissioning a range of treatment services.

Description of activity

Northern Queensland Primary Health Network (NQPHN) commissions a number of service providers to deliver culturally appropriate alcohol and other drug (AOD) treatment services across the NQPHN footprint to ensure timely and equitable access to support. NQPHN also commissions place-based AOD services to address the needs of remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities in the Cape and Torres region and builds the local capacity of these communities.

Commissioned services align supports to social and emotional wellbeing approaches to ensure the breadth of a person's needs can be responded to.

NQPHN commissioned alcohol and other drugs treatment activities will continue to align with recommendations in the *National Drug Strategy 2017-2026*.

AOD - 3 - Core AOD and Operational

Activity priorities and description

Program key priority areas

Alcohol and Other Drugs.

Aim of activity

The purpose of this activity is to address identified service gaps and challenges to access in community-based alcohol and other drug treatment interventions by commissioning a range of treatment services across the northern Queensland footprint.

Description of activity

Northern Queensland Primary Health Network (NQPHN) commissions a number of service providers to deliver alcohol and other drug (AOD) treatment services including brief intervention, counselling, and care coordination options. A focus of the activity is improving timely access for young people, particularly those living in regional, rural, and remote areas.

NQPHN's focus areas

- Ongoing stakeholder engagement to increase access and reduce stigma related impacts on access.
- Integration of referral pathways and programs with a range of localised service options, including mental health services commissioned by NQPHN.
- Improving AOD service delivery capacity within primary health care services.
- Education to enhance capacity within primary health care.
- Participation and implementation of the NQ Joint Regional Wellbeing Plan as it articulates AOD as a key priority.
- Promotion of Alcohol and Drug Information Service (ADIS) to ensure access to supports for individuals with limited or no access to face-to-face options.

AOD - 4 - Drug and Alcohol Treatment Service Maintenance (DATSM)

Activity priorities and description

Program key priority areas

Alcohol and Other Drugs.

Aim of activity

To provide eligible commissioned services with supplementary payments to replace Social and Community Services (SACS) payments as a transition phase.

Description of activity

Northern Queensland Primary Health Network (NQPHN) commission services to deliver alcohol and other drug (AOD) services who require Drug and Alcohol Treatment Service Maintenance (DATSM) supplementary payments following the cessation of SACS.

This funding is used in the delivery of the services against staff cost line items in contract budgets.
